

Emergency Medical Relief Program EMRP

Purpose: The Emergency Medical Relief Program will provide or fund emergency medical care and services for any candidate animal in need. The programs' purpose will be to provide emergency medical relief to injured or sick animals in need of care on an acute and emergent basis.

Mission: The mission of EMRP is to prevent animal suffering and aid in relief in emergency circumstances. To provide medical treatment for acute onset of illness or injury that would otherwise not be provided medical care and set the animal on a path to recovery.

Required Qualifications To Receive Program Support:

1. The animal must be injured and or sick/ill requiring medical treatment
2. The animal must not have an alternative means of intervention or have a viable means of support in place that can provide immediate medical treatment

Applicant Process for Program Support: Once the animal has been selected and meets the Required Qualification's, the animal can then be listed as a candidate for the EMRP program.

Candidate Process: Once the animal is listed as a candidate the volunteer team will begin the process of recovering and or transporting the animal to an ER, establishing the onset of emergency health care and then placement/quarantine as necessary.

EMR To Recovery: Once the animal has received emergency medical relief treatment, after care and long-term medical needs will be established to support the animal to full recovery. Whether the animal is taken into NPAR sanctuary living or able to return/stay in original environment, follow up services will remain in place until no longer required.

Policies:

1. Medication or treatment cannot be denied based on cost of treatment or deposit required for medical services.
2. Once accepted into the EMRP the animal will be followed through to complete healing and safe placement as necessary.
3. EMRP may accept any animal and deny no animal based on species or any other factors, there are zero exceptions to prevent care for any animal.
4. This program practices a NO KILL policy with zero exceptions outside of euthanasia being medically necessary or provided as compassionate hospice for illness, disease or untreatable discomfort. Required prerequisites of both the animal no longer being willing or able to fight to stay alive with there additionally being no marked improvement in recovery with all necessary treatments available under veterinary care to at all become eligible for compassionate end of life care.
